3.2.6 Major activities during the year in the sphere of extension activities and Institutional social responsibility

- Under the extension activity of our college, the department of zoology organized a rally on “Water Conservation” on 11.08.2016 at Vaipauttanpatti. Pamphlets were distributed by the students of I B.Sc Zoology .The villagers are educated about the methods of water conservation. A rally on “Awareness of Dengue” was organized at Inamreddiapatti. Students of III B.Sc., Zoology

participated in this rally and distributed Nila Vembu decoction to 600 village people.

- The blood group identification programme was conducted by the students of III B.Sc. Zoology at Inamreddiapatti in Virudhunagar District on 19.08.2016.
- The Department of History organized an awareness programme on “Rights and Problems of Children” on 10.09.2016 at Chattirareddiyapatti village, in which 40 students and 8 staff members participated.
- Leprosy survey programme was conducted by the students of I B.Sc. Zoology at Kadambankulam, Virudhunagar District on 18.10.2016. Students surveyed nearly 200 families in the village.
- Students of I B.Sc. Zoology planted nearly 30 saplings at Vaiputtanpatti on 23.12.2016. Pamphlets were distributed to the villagers to edify the value of trees.
- Final year Zoology students participated in the planting of saplings at Inamreddiapatti on 23.12.2016. Pamphlets were distributed to the village people.
- As a part of Extension activities, twenty students of Department of Tamil with two teaching faculty went to Aavalsooranpatti and Koolancheri on 12.01.2017. The students created awareness about Malaria and Dengue fever among the villagers and suggested preventive measures by distributing pamphlets.
- The Department of Home Science (Nutrition and Dietetics) organized an extension activity in Chinnamoopanpatti, Sivagnapuram Panchayath, Virudhunagar on 31.01.2017. Height, Weight and Hemoglobin level of the village people were recorded by the students of B.Sc. Nutrition and Dietetics. The students exhibited anemia related charts in the village and disseminated the knowledge on the importance of iron rich foods to prevent anemia to the public. A mime show was conducted to create awareness about the symptoms of anemia, importance of iron and ways to prevent anemia. The students also gave demonstration on the preparation of juices. Beet root juice and Amla juice were distributed to them. They emphasized the importance of having

Beet root and Amla in their daily diet to prevent anemia.

- A team of twenty students of III B.A. English Literature extended their service to the people of Aavalsooranpatti on 12.01.2017 and Chinnamoopanpatti on 30.01.2017. The volunteers went to the Municipal schools in the villages and insisted the students on personal cleanliness. The volunteers imparted the importance of being clean and maintaining hygienic surroundings.
- To emphasize the importance of energy saving and to popularize the energy saving devices, III B.Sc., Physics students went on a rally and distributed pamphlets to the rural people of K.Usilampatti on 08.02.2017.
- Anti-Larva checking awareness programme was organized at Chengunrapuram. Fifteen students of Mathematics participated in the programme. The participants went to each house in a locality and checked for mosquito larva in the water stored. To prevent the growth of larva in the rain water collected in the waste materials, the people were instructed to remove the garbage regularly and keep their surroundings clean. The students distributed pamphlets to insist that the people should protect themselves from dengue fever and Chikungunya.
- III B.Sc. Zoology & I B.Sc. Chemistry (Botany Ancillary students) visited Kunthalapatti village on 03.02.2017. They created awareness about “Dengue Fever” and pamphlets were also distributed to insist on the importance of “Roof garden” and “Trees”.
- III B.Sc. Biochemistry students and staff members in collaboration with Jana Clinical Laboratory, Virudhunagar analyzed the Blood grouping and HB content of rural children, Kallikkudi on 04.02.2017 and the results observed were reported to them. The children who had low levels of HB were considered to be anemic and they were advised to take foods rich in iron to maintain their HB level. They were also educated about the nutritional importance and suggested diets to improve HB.

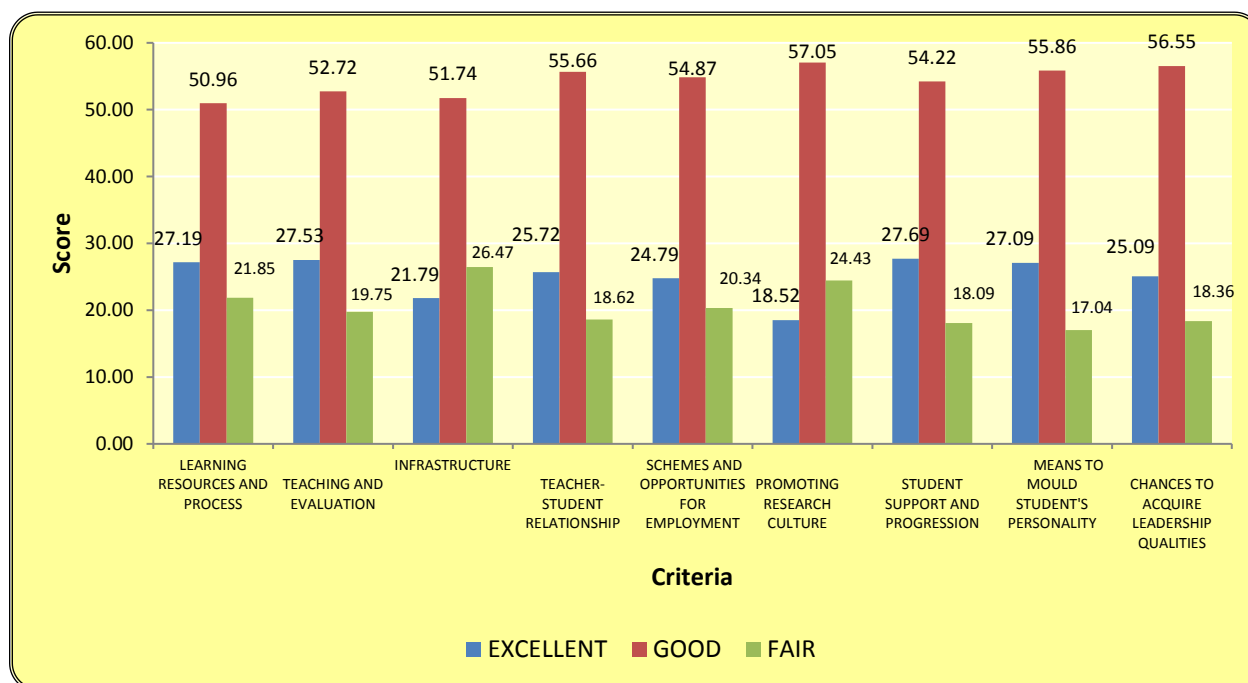
